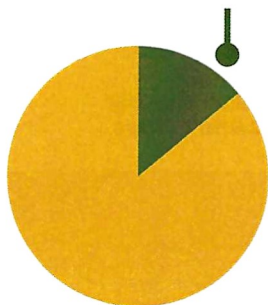

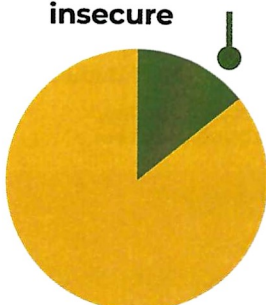

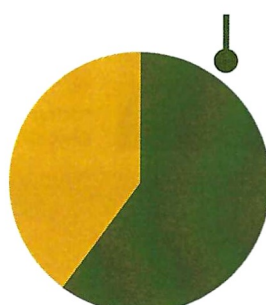

Thank you for being part of our Second Harvest family. You are changing lives and creating hope.

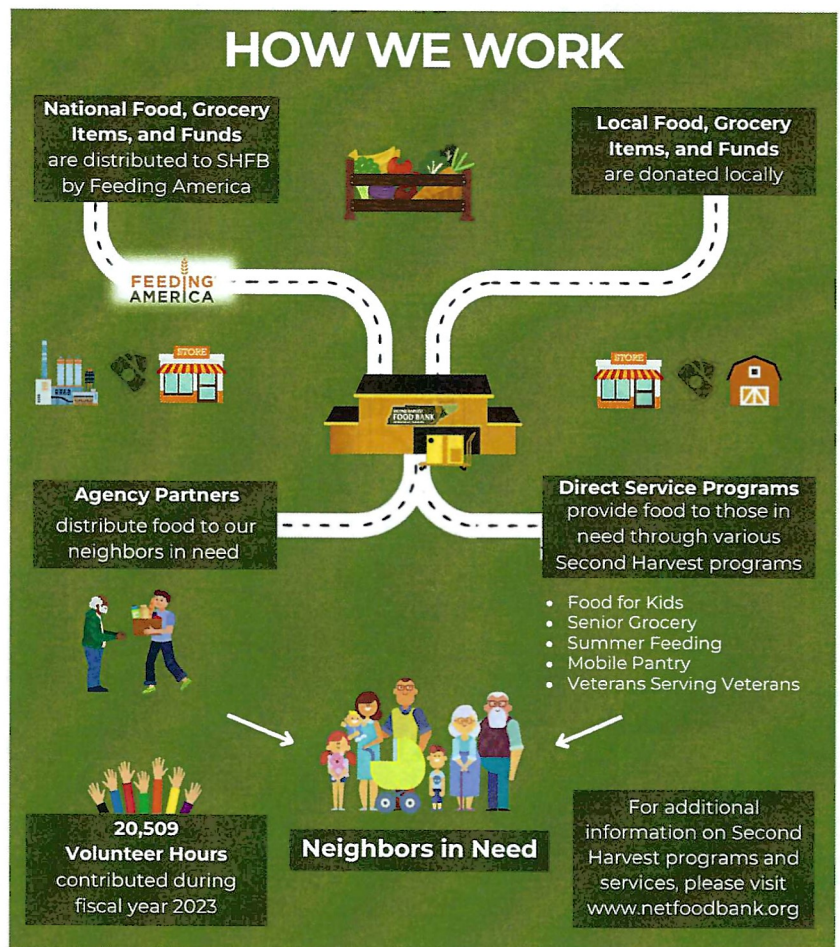

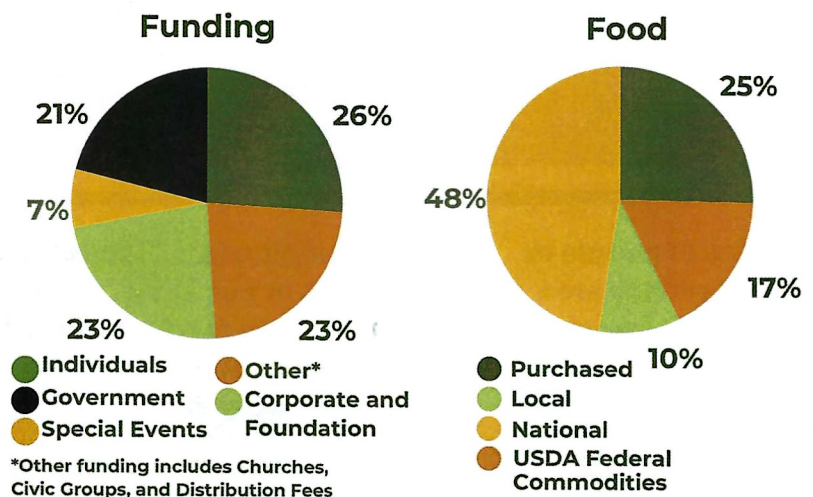
